



Responding to Incidents, Disclosures, and Suspicions of Child Abuse Four Critical Actions

1 Responding

If a child is at risk of immediate harm you must ensure their safety by:

- Separating alleged victims and others involved
- Administering first aid
- Calling 000 for agent medical and/or police assistance to respond to immediate health or safety concerns
- Identifying a contact person for future liaison with Police

If there is no immediate harm go to Action 2

2 Reporting

Any incident must be documented on the Chabad Youth Child Abuse Incident Report

Where does the source of suspected abuse come from?

Within the family or community

Report to the Victoria Department of Human Services.
Report to your local police.

Report internally to Moshe Kahn / Menachem Lipskier

Within the organisation

Report to the Victoria Department of Human Services.
Report to your local police.

You must also report internally to Moshe Kahn / Menachem Lipskier who then needs to report to CIVL Board.

3 Contacting

Your organisation must consult with Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) for child protection concerns and the Commission for Children and Young People for reportable conduct in Victoria, or the local police to determine if the information can be shared with parents/carers.

This can include

- Not to contact the parents carers in circumstances where they have alleged to have engaged in the abuse or the child is a mature minor and does not wish their parent/carer to be contacted.
- To contact the parents/carers and provide agreed information as soon as possible.

4 Supporting

Your organisation should provide support for children impacted by abuse which could include: the development of a safety plan, direct support and/or a referral to wellbeing professionals.
