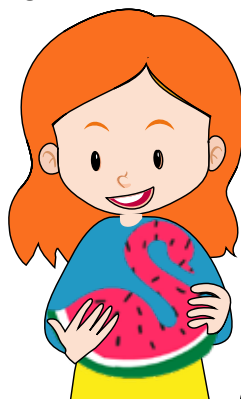


☆ EDIBLE ART ☆

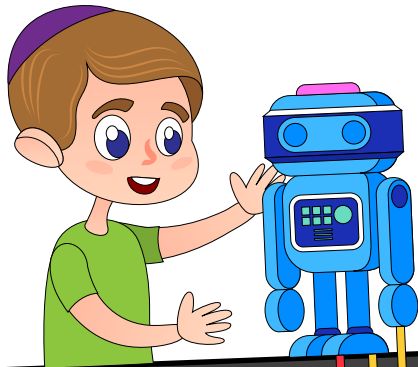

Do people play chess because it is so much fun or because it is good for their brain? At the Chabad Youth Chess Club, students are taught the strategies and logic of the game in a fun environment.

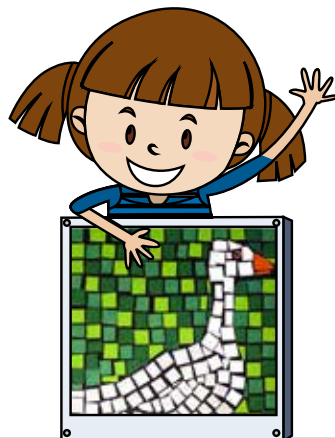

COVID 19 POLICY

Arrival

At the start of OSHC Children will;

- Enter OSHC premises from the rear entry door in the corridor. This is adjacent to the playground (only this door)
- Parents bringing their children to the OSHC premises will need to use the rear door. They will not be allowed in the building.
- have their temperature taken.
- sanitise their hands.
- Snacks provided will be in individual portions, as to minimise handling amongst the children.

Departure

At the end of the OSHC session, children will need to be collected from the Mochkin building drive through. Those children who have permission to leave will be signed out from that location, and dismissed from there. The driveway gates will close promptly at 5:20pm, please ensure that you are on time to collect your children.

Exclusion from OSHC

- Any person with a temperature above 37.5° will be excluded from the OSHC facility.
- Any person who is displaying symptoms such as: fever, coughing, sore throat, fatigue or shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, must seek urgent medical attention to determine if they need to be tested for COVID-19 and not attend the program under any circumstance. They will not be allowed to return to OSHC without medical clearance, which may be either a medical certificate or a Corona test result. This would also apply to siblings /immediate household family members, or any potential close contacts.
- Any child who begins to display any of the above symptoms will be immediately

isolated and the parents / guardian contacted to collect the child. Children MUST be collected within a maximum of a half hour of the parent/guardian being contacted by our staff. If you are called to collect your child please call the office upon arrival. The student will not be permitted to return to OSHC without clearance from a medical practitioner. This exclusion would also apply to siblings

Isolation/Quarantine

- Any person entering Australia from any international destination will be required to undertake 14-day quarantine as per the Australian Government guidelines.
- Any person who has been in close contact (as defined by DHHS) with someone who has a positive diagnosis must self-isolate for 14 days.
- Household members of a person who has a confirmed case (including children) of COVID-19 must also be isolated from the OSHC service and general public.
- Families must immediately advise the OSHC service if they, or anyone in their family, develops any symptoms of the virus or receives a positive result of the virus whilst in isolation.

How to prevent the spread of Covid-19
if your child is sick, do not send them to OSHC.

- do not visit OSHC if you or another family member is unwell.
- avoid physical contact with other people who may be sick- such as older people and people with existing health conditions.
- Implement effective hygiene measures
- sanitise your hands at regular intervals throughout the day.
- clean and disinfect high touch surfaces regularly (door handles, car seats, mobile phone, toys, dummies).
- promote strictest hygiene measures when preparing food at home.

ABOUT US

Our Philosophy:

We believe that all children have the right to experience quality child care. Traditional Jewish values and ethics as promulgated by the Torah are central to the philosophy of our institutions. These values include belief in G-d, love of fellow man, respect for parents, pride in Judaism, study of Torah and observance and appreciation of Mitzvos.

Each child is encouraged to recognise their own self-worth and that through the particular gifts and abilities that G-d has bestowed upon them, they are able to better the world.

Essential to the centre's philosophy is the need to maintain a warm, positive and co-operative environment in which students can grow and learn. Such a nurturing environment is deemed vital for the development of self-esteem, and confidence.

Our Aftercare & Vacation Care aim is to support the wellbeing and development of the "whole child", and as such provide a balance of social, religious and secular themes as well as life skills, to promote the child's complete personal development. The overall philosophy is developed in collaboration with children, educators, families, community and management. This process respects and values the views of all and enhances clarity and understanding

between all users of the service.

Our philosophy draws on values held by educators, families and management and reflects the needs and values of the community. We value each and every child as capable and confident, regardless of their capabilities and background within the context of the family and we believe that the family is the primary educator of each child. Each child's family knows their child best, and staff will work in partnership with families to ensure the best outcomes for children.

We believe that children's learning in our setting complements their learning at home and at school however the importance of relationships and strengthening each child's strengths, skills, talents and interest is priority. We recognise and value that children's learning and development evolves through their relationships where they shape their own identities to become active citizens.

At Chabad Youth we strive to promote children to experience, meaningful and joyful learning to enrich their childhood. We value and encourage each child to be involved in decision making that influence their learning, wellbeing, development and decisions that affect their world.

We as educators and the service will be guided at all times by the Early Childhood Code of Ethics (2006), National Quality Framework and all Early Education and Care legislation.

OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS CARE

Outside school hours care centres provide care for primary school aged children, before and after school, during school holidays and on pupil-free days.

Vacation care is a type of outside school hour's care that includes indoor and outdoor activities. These centres are sometimes run by the same organisation that runs before and after-school care.

The majority of outside school hours care centers are approved child care services. This means that families using the service may be eligible for the Child Care Subsidy. Approved services must also show that they are meeting certain quality standards.

CHILD CARE SUBSIDY

Child Care Subsidy (CCS) is paid by the Australian Government to help families with the cost of childcare fees.

This subsidy is paid directly to childcare providers.

Three things will determine a family's level of Child Care Subsidy:

1. Combined family income
2. Activity level of parents
3. Type of child care service

Some basic requirements must be

satisfied for an individual to be eligible to receive Child Care Subsidy for a child. These include:

- the age of the child (must be 13 or under and not attending secondary school)
- the child meeting immunisation requirements
- the individual, or their partner, meeting the residency requirements.

To claim this subsidy, you will need to submit a claim through myGov.

To find more information about Child Care Subsidy (CCS), please visit the Department of Human Services website or call 13 61 50.

Please note that CCS does not apply to absent days at the start or end of a day camp program. Parents will be liable for the full fee.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS TERMS AND CONDITIONS

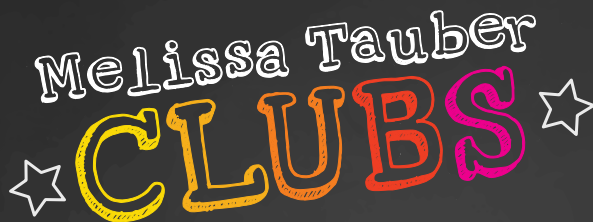
- Please note that after the first week of term children will be unable to switch between clubs.
